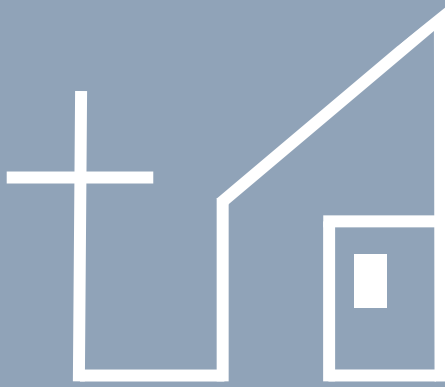

Growing enrollment has stretched our facilities, urging expansion. ALA's last major project was four decades ago, and much has changed in our community. LAUNCHING. INVESTING.

God's blessings continue at ALA. We aim to grow from 235 to 300 students by fall 2027, reaching more teens from our federation churches, schools, and the community. We want to share the gospel with even more students.

To fulfill this vision, we're launching a \$11 million campus building project, with an initial goal of raising \$6+ million in philanthropic support, and we're seeking your support.

EXPANDING

Locally and throughout the Valley, population projections show that Laveen/South Mountain will nearly double in size from 2000 to 2026. The Lutheran elementary schools that have long been fantastic partners are also growing and expanding their school ministries. While our community has public and charter schools, there is no other Christian high school, making us a sought-after school choice.



STEM

STEM education is growing quickly and is desired by both colleges and employers. Our current program offers three classes, but facility limitations keep us from delivering the full-scale STEM program we want to offer to our students.



ATHLETICS

Athletics has proven to be a successful tool for connecting with churches, schools, and community. Our junior wrestling, basketball, and volleyball programs attract future Coyotes. But right now, gym space is limited for community impact as our own sports programs grow in number and competitiveness.



FACILITIES

ALA's current enrollment means maximizing every classroom throughout the entire day. Many of the classrooms are crowded with little space to work in groups or spread out.

And with athletics and fine arts (choir, band, drama) sharing the same gym, the space no longer allows the programs to increase their participation, excellence, and impact.

THE PAST INSPIRES OUR FUTURE

When the new ALA campus was dedicated on January 11, 1987, the Academy's first principal, Robert Adickes, made remarks that still ring true: "God has set the course of ALA and how it serves young people—exciting, unique, and growing! We can look to God as we step forward into the future—if we are willing to follow His leadership. It depends on vision, faith, sacrifice, a willingness to know His will, and do it—nothing more, nothing less, and nothing else."

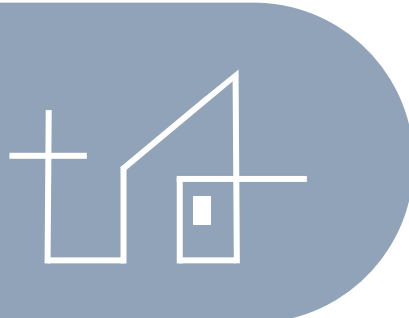
Principal Adickes' words inspire our vision today for the future of ALA.



ENVISIONING

To meet the needs of future Coyotes, we must expand and enhance our campus. To accomplish that, work will occur in phases that will help us better deliver our mission.

Take a moment to envision this...



Phase 1, has an estimated cost of \$11 million. God willing, it will be complete by July 2026.

This phase will provide our students with

- more and upgraded classrooms to accommodate our growing student body.
- a second gym to help both our sports and fine arts programs. Teams will be able to schedule and hold additional practices and games, while fine arts will be able to better utilize our original gym, including being able to stage more than one production each year.

In the phases that follow, students will get access to dedicated worship and praise space. Envision a new multipurpose auditorium that will create a better environment for worship *and* a setting for gatherings and productions. Other additions include new office space and final round of classrooms.





Overview of Campus Enhancements

- 5 classrooms with state-of-the-art technology to enhance student learning and give teachers more tools to mentor students and connect classroom learning with lifelong skills.
- A spacious, modern gym with a college-sized main court, two full side courts, more bleacher seating, office space for the Athletic Director, locker rooms, and colorful branding to celebrate the Coyote Nation—space that will meet team needs for practices and games as well as community sports programs.
